2000 – 10 October	<u>CECOP General Assembly</u> approves that 7,5% of the total membership fees to CECOP be dedicated to CICOPA's international activity, as of 2001
2002 – 14 June	<u>CICOPA Executive Committee</u> decides to transfer the CICOPA secretariat to the CECOP headquarters in Brussels
2004 – January	The transfer of the CICOPA secretariat to the CECOP headquarters is implemented
